Correcting the Wrong Idea of Humility

Following the **law of humility** leads to interior peace, joy, wisdom, and a greater share in God's glory.

That's what Christ **wants** for us: the more we **grow** in humility, the more we will experience those things.

All of us want those things, so why aren't we all growing in humility?

One thing that can **stunt** our humility growth is the **wrong idea** of what humility really is: we can't **practice** it if we can't **recognize** it.

One common misconception is that being **humble** means having low self-esteem.

That's not true.

Being humble means having the only **solid** and **lasting foundation for real self-esteem** that we can **have**: knowledge that our lives and our happiness are **gifts** from a God who **knows** us through and through and **loves** us unconditionally.

If we base our self-esteem on anything **else** - our own **achievements**, other people's **praise** - sooner or later it will **collapse**.

Another, even **more** dangerous, misconception is that humility is **passive and boring**. Humble people, we think, just go around like **zombies** doing what everyone tells them to do.

That's not true either.

In this parable, Jesus didn't condemn the **desire** to do and achieve great things.

He actually **encouraged** his host to **seek a reward**: "... the one who humbles himself will **be exalted**... For you will **be repaid** at the resurrection..."

Humble Christians are **MORE** active, courageous and adventurous than **arrogant** ones, because they know that they have **nothing to lose** - their life is completely in God's hands.

Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta and Pope John Paul II were both extremely **humble**, and yet they were full of life, vigor, **creativity**, and joy.

Humility does **not** mean having **low self-esteem** or being **bored**. Humility is about **living life to the full**, by stepping **off** the **dark throne** of arrogance and into the **bright throne-room** of **Christ the King**.

Today, let's ask Jesus to help us take that step - once and for all.
